My Children

I Recd your letter & can rest
easy also a better time since saying that
you would leave about the middle of Feb unless
these circumstances I honestly know what to advise
you to do should Mr Wood determine to continue
the Ministry as things are now he will have
better to bow to slavery or he will be
compelled to leave the Ministry as he will
not be able to find a Church of the pres-
byterian or Congregational order that will
employ him if he is determined to preach the
whole truth and against every sin & I have
rather he would beg than go with a papulous
& wicked public opinion

should he determine on continuing the Ministry
I think he ought to go to Bridgeport as they
have dismissed their Minister & are looking for
another as you will see by the enclosed letter
I recd from Susan which will show you the state
of affairs there if I had my st affairs adjusted
as I expect I shall have by next fall I would
hint to you that it would be best for you to
come to Netica but as it is at present I do not
know as it would be best yet I should be
glad to see you on the subject

We are now well I have been quite unwell
for 2 or 3 weeks altho I have lost but 3
days Mrs Merrill & all our friends are well
I should by all to be at your place
on Tuesday next but it will heart of my
pains to cause your mother feel that she can
not come this winter I hope you will come
as you hinted in Mr Woods letter
Has Mr Morse opposed the abomination
of the Board of Care for foreign Missions
to his church with regard to Organic sin
if he has not I hope he will let the
consequences be what they may for I do
hope that the idea that organic sin is less
heinous than individual sin is a Millers
pervertion of the truth & I hope that Mr
Morse will cheer his garments by opposing
the abomination
